SECOND AMENDMENTS TO THE POLICE CBA 2012-2014

First. Section 8, *Compensatory Time*, add a new paragraph "D" as follows:

D. The Chief of Police may, at his or her discretion, approve additional compensatory time for Field Training Officers for up to five (5) additional compensatory days for exemplary service. These additional compensatory days must be used by the Field Training Officer within the time designated by the Chief of Police and are subject to and are part of the limitations in sections A and B above.

Second. Section 22, *Salary*, is amended to replace Appendix B, "A New Salary Schedule for Members Hired After January 1, 2013," as annexed hereto and made a part hereof.

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A NEW CAPITAL BUDGET LINE IN THE 2013 JOINT SEWAGE BOARD BUDGET FOR PLANT OUTFALL PERIODIC DREDGING AND AUTHORIZE THE TRANSFER OF EXISTING FUNDS IN THE "PLANT OUTFALL DREDGING/MAINT" LINE OF THE OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE BUDGET TO THE NEW CAPITAL BUDGET LINE.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Binghamton and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Johnson City jointly approve the annual budget of the Binghamton-Johnson City Joint Sewage Board ("JSB"); and

WHEREAS, Inter-Municipal Agreement No. IX (IMA-IX) sets forth the procedure for the JSB to request approval of budget transfers and modifications during the year or within 30 days thereafter so long as any transfers do not increase the JSB's budgeted expenses for the year; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Binghamton requests a new Capital line be created in the JSB's budget; and

WHEREAS, the JSB has complied with the IMA-IX procedure, and it is appropriate to modify the JSB's 2013 budgets by making the budget transfers authorized herein, which transfers do not change the total amount of the JSB's 2013 Operations and Maintenance budget,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby resolve as follows:

Section 1. A new capital budget line is hereby authorized to be created in the Joint Sewage Board 2013 Budget to be named "PLANT OUTFALL PERIODIC DREDGING" and the Joint Sewage Board Fiscal Officer is directed and authorized to create such new capital budget line and transfer \$425,000 in unencumbered funds from 2013 budget line J8130.54800 ("PLANT OUTFALL DREDGING/MAINTENANCE") to the new line so created;


Section 2. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon approval by a majority of the Board of Trustees of the Village and a majority of the Council of the City of Binghamton.





Such permit shall authorize the permit holder to operate an Outdoor Café during (a) the permit holder's regular business hours, or (b) between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 10:00 P.M. Sunday through Thursday and between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 11:00 P.M. Friday through Saturday, whichever is less. Outdoor Café operations must cease at the times indicated herein. Operation of an Outdoor Café outside of the permissible hours shall constitute a violation of this Ordinance, and shall constitute grounds for the revocation of an Outdoor Café permit, in accordance with § 327-2.L.
