**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE
ABANDONMENT OF FLYNN AVENUE AS A
PUBLIC STREET**

WHEREAS, General City Law § 20.7 permits a city to discontinue a public street if it is no longer necessary for public use; and

WHEREAS, Flynn Avenue has not been used for a public street; and

WHEREAS, in order to confirm that Flynn Avenue has not been used as a public street, the Council of the City of Binghamton duly advertised and held a public hearing on May 6, 2015, to officially abandon Flynn Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that Flynn Avenue has not been used as a public street and is no longer necessary for any public use.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Flynn Avenue is not a public street and is no longer necessary for any public use.

Section 2. That the Department of Public Works is authorized to take necessary action to properly discontinue Flynn Avenue as a public street.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
