WHEREAS, pursuant to Permanent Resolution R12-81, dated November 7, 2012, the City of Binghamton authorized a grant in the amount of \$100,000 from the Dormitory Authority New York State for a portable stage and park improvements; and

WHEREAS, there is a remainder of \$21,890 from said grant; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to repurpose the \$21,890 to be used for the OurSpace Project at Recreational Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby:

RESOLVE that the Mayor, or his designee, is hereby authorized to apply to the Dormitory Authority New York State to repurpose the remainder of \$21,890 from the grant approved and accepted by Permanent Resolution R12-81, to be used for the OurSpace Project at Recreational Park.

WHEREAS, the City of Binghamton is eligible to receive a \$100,000.00 grant from the Dormitory Authority New York State for a portable stage and improvements at up to three parks associated with the Design Your Own Park Initiative; and

WHEREAS, the application requires the approval and endorsement of the governing body of the municipality in which the project will be located.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Binghamton, duly convened in regular session, does hereby:

RESOLVE, that Council does hereby approve and endorse the application of the City of Binghamton to the Dormitory Authority New York State in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 for a portable stage and improvements at up to three parks associated with the Design Your Own Park Initiative; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the total cost of the project is \$100,000.00, there is no local match; the Director of Planning and Community Development will be the grant project manager; and that the anticipated date of project completion is Fall 2013; and be it further

RESOLVED, that upon approval of said application the Mayor, or his designee, is hereby authorized to enter into and execute an agreement, approved as to form and content by the Office of Corporation Counsel, with the State to accept such grant.

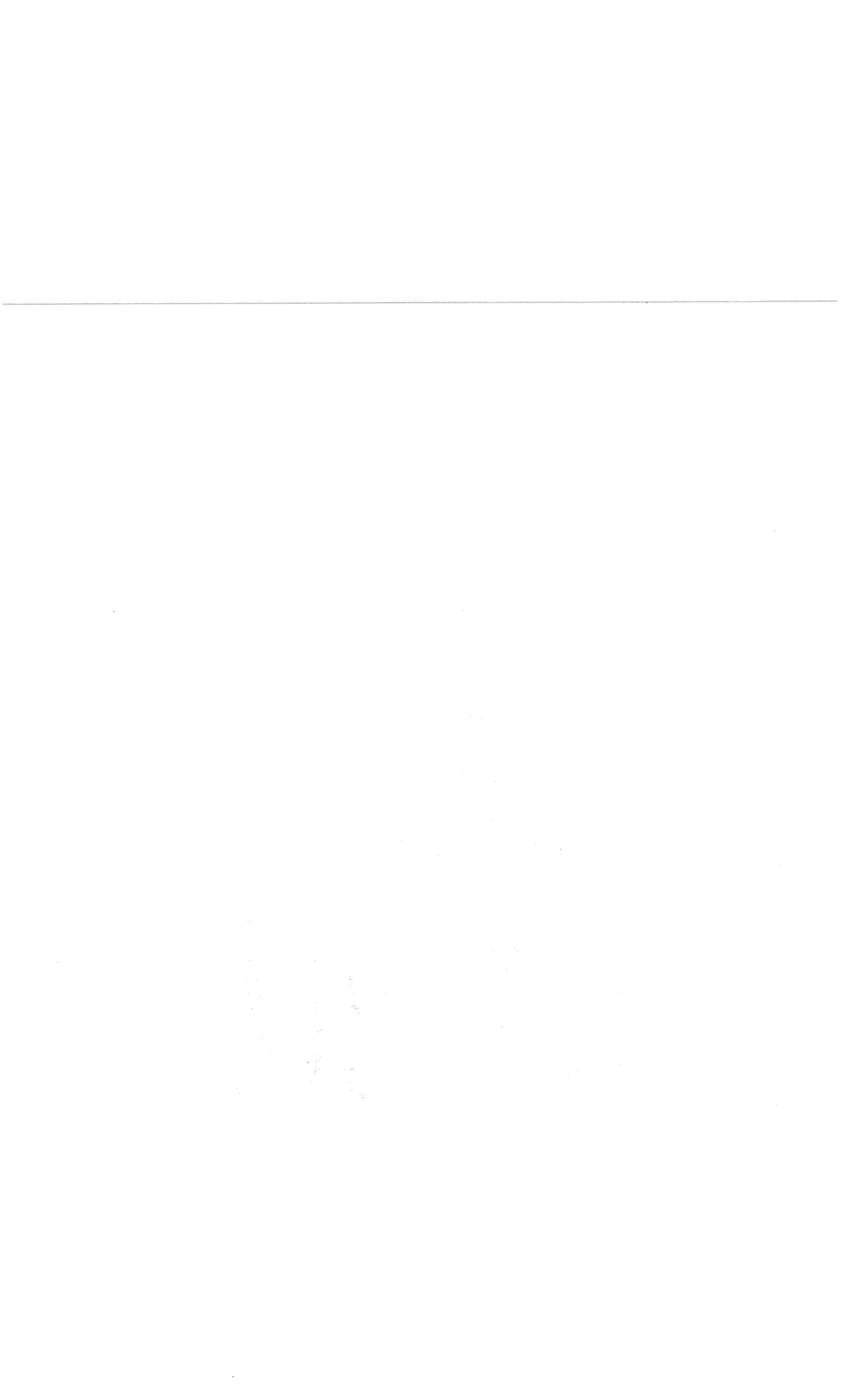

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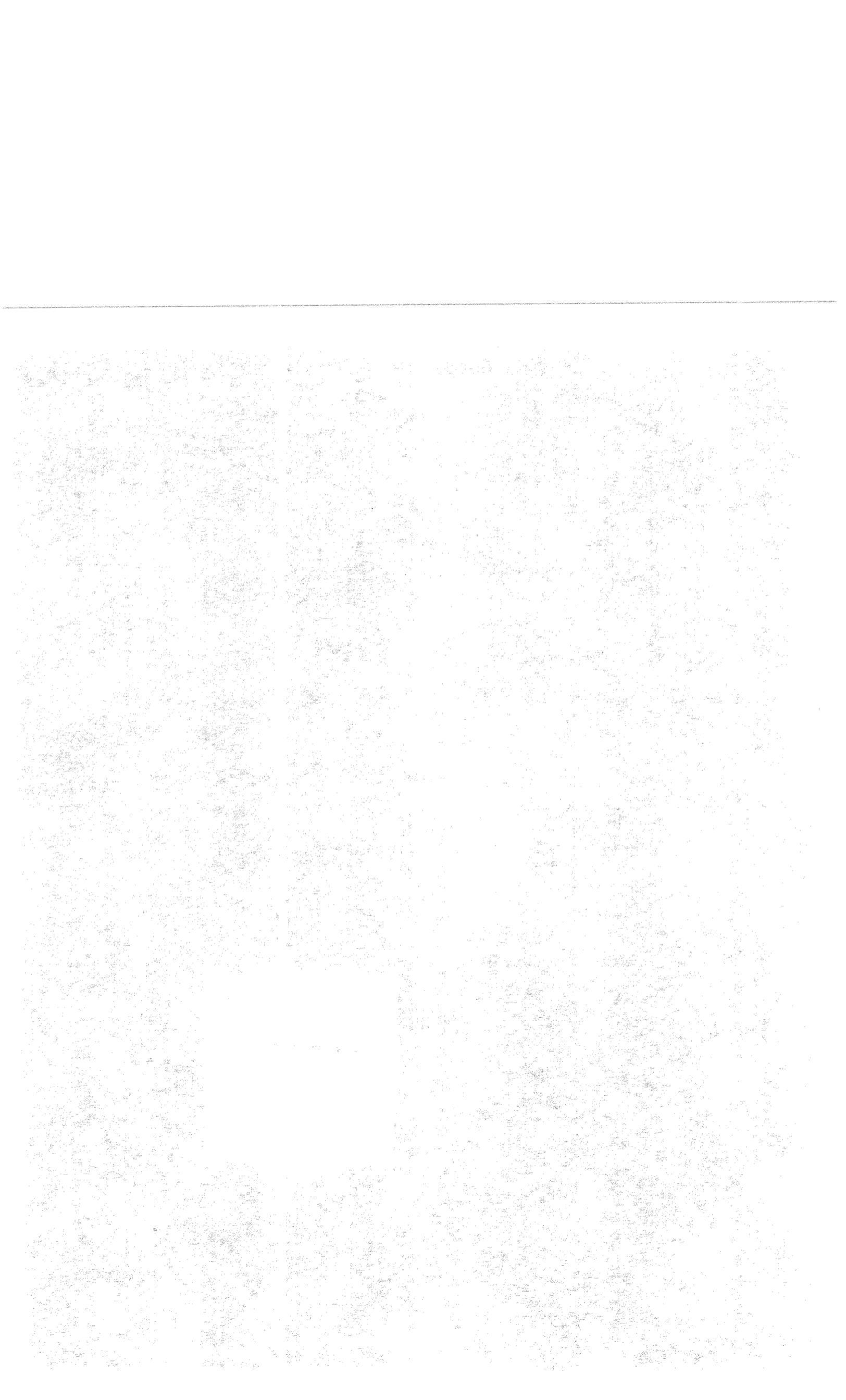

not) during final design phase.

- Also, I requested (multiple times, and spoke directly with design consultants) to consider adding flood wall treatments down through the Magic City Ice property. This building is under city control, and will be nominated for inclusion in Land Bank application (June 2014) for demolition funds. The current design for gateway project calls for wall treatments from Prospect Street to Magic City Ice. Once this building is demolished, it will look really bad if this wall remains in awful condition and then fully exposed. Nevertheless, there is definitely a cost here, and the walls on the Magic City Ice property are in far worse shape than those originally scheduled for treatment.

Columbus Park Spray Pad

- Director has been grant manager for this project
- Construction vendor under contract, and has been given notice to proceed by Engineering, which is managing and inspecting the construction (project manager, Diana).
- All funds are encumbered (approximately \$175,000)
 - \$65,000, from \$100,000 DASNY Community Capital Assistance Grant (secured by Lupardo)
 - \$15,000, donation from Binghamton Rotary Lunch Club
 - Remainder from CDBG funds (CDY38 Public Infrastructure & CDY39 Parks)
- Make sure project includes plaque with Rotary Wheel (draft design was shared by Procon, so looks like this should be fine, but given importance to Rotary Club, wanted to make sure this was on radar)
- Make sure future media outreach references all funders, including Community Foundation of South Central NY (we corrected release online, so should be fine, but again, given the importance of this to CFSCNY, wanted to make sure this was on radar)

DASNY – Community Capital Assistance Grant

- \$100,000 grant, all paperwork in order and in project folder on K Drive
- \$65,000 for Columbus Park and \$35,000 for mobile stage, Parks
 - I notified Parks via email on 12/21/13 that they should move forward with procurement of state (they will need to coordinate with Karen, as PHCD has sole access to grant line in MUNIS)
 - Should be ready for close-out in summer/fall of 2014

Design Your Own Park

- As part of agreement with Lupardo in securing the \$100,000 grant above, City earmarked \$15,000 of CDBG funds for each of the three DYOP sites (Bark Park, Walnut Park, Sunflower Park)
 - A tracking sheet is available on K Drive in DYOP project folder (and was shared with DYOP partners in early December)
- PHCD has not been participating in monthly DYOP meetings, and Director Barber has assumed
